

Color Guide For Top Stitching

Heavy lines which appear on the graph denote Back and some Straight stitching to be done using 1-ply of floss, unless otherwise indicated.

BACK STITCHED AREAS

Hands, faces, noses, eyebrows
and some eyes (2-ply)
Signature (2-ply)
Mouths (2-ply)
Some eyes
All other Back stitching

STITCHING TIPS

1. Before stitching it's a good idea to thoroughly rinse floss colors.
2. For easier stitching, cut your fibers into 18" lengths.
3. Avoid knots on the back of your fabric whenever possible. To begin, hold 1" of fiber end on the back side of fabric and cover by working several stitches over it. To bind off, run fiber end through backs of several stitches.
4. Maintain an even tension on fibers while stitching.
5. Use 2-ply of floss for all Cross Stitching.
6. Some floss colors have been combined to achieve more delicate shading. Use 1-ply of each of the floss colors indicated in the needle at the same time.
7. Some 1/4 Cross stitches have been charted to achieve the shapes of the children's faces. These stitches are recognizable when two symbols appear within one block on the graph. Consult the stitch diagrams when working these stitches.
